
2. Who We Are


BOSCONET Organogram

Creating opportunities for Vulnerable Youth

A National Mega Job Mela' - job placement for vulnerable youth

 Partner: Bosconet through 'Dhisha' – the Don Bosco Network center for career guidance and job placement for unemployed youth in India

• Reach: Over 286 job seekers

• Beneficiaries: 157 youth recruited

Location: Hyderabad

Intervention: In keeping with its commitment towards the vulnerable youth of India, the Don Bosco Network –Bosconet held a 'National Mega Job Mela' through 'Disha' – the Don Bosco Network center for career guidance and job placement for unemployed youth in India.

The job mela hosted 32 companies and saw over 286 job seekers. Interviews were conducted in person as well as IT companies, corporates, banks & pharmaceutical companies were invited to be part of the mela, and over 157 youth were recruited. These youngsters have started off on a path filled with possibility and hope.



Empowering the Young at Risk

Don Bosco Network cares for and promotes quality education to marginalised children and youth to foster new beginnings through a series of collaborations and support from different partners for various concerns.

















1. Street to School

Partner: Austrian Embassy

• Beneficiaries: 100 slum children

Aid: Education, solar lamps, blankets

· Location: Palam, Delhi

Intervention: In a bid to raise the standard of living and give hope to the children and families living under the Palam bridge, Delhi.

With the funding support of the Austrian Embassy, Bosconet has taken care of over 100 poor children and their families living under the Palam Bridge, in Delhi by providing education, solar lamps, blankets, etc.



2. Delivering SMiLEs

- Partner: Amazon India
- Beneficiaries: Technology and education for children of 6 Don Bosco Schools
- Aid: 92 computer systems in 6 schools
- Location: Assam, Manipur, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya and Tripura

Intervention: Bosconet partnered with Amazon to purchase and install 92 computer systems in six Don Bosco schools located across the North East. These schools operate in remote regions and cater to the educational needs of marginalized, rural and tribal students.

The labs set-up under this programme enables poor tribal students to learn computer skills as a part of their regular curriculam.



3. A Gift Of Better Life

- Partner: The GIC (General Insurance Company)
- Beneficiaries: Over 32000 children of 6 Don Bosco Schools
- Aid: Ambulance services, timely medical intervention & support
- Location: Ramanthapur, Hyderabad



Intervention: A gift of an Ambulance from the General Insurance Company (GIC) came to fruition at the Don Bosco Navajeevan, Ramanthapur, Hyderabad. Navajeevan has been the home for over 32000 poor children and more than 13000 children and youth have received aid in some form through the home.

The ambulance is a great support for the children of the home and the people in the surrounding slums and colonies who lack medical support. Timely medical intervention can help save and sustain many lives that come through the home.

4. Remedial Education for Life

• Partner: PWC

• Reach/Beneficiaries: 400 children

• Aid: Remedial education, nutrition, educational materials

• Location: Tangra, Kolkata

Intervention: Tangra and Kolkata have a massive slum-dwelling population. Children living in these slums are engaged in waste-picking, begging and other menial work. School closures and inaccessibility to digital devices led to the children dropping out of schools.

NITIKA Don Bosco through its outreach programs have reached out to families and supported their children in enrolling at school.

PWC supported the programme ensuring 400 children between the ages 6-14 years, received continuous education through remedial classes and support through nutrition kits and educational materials.



5. Saksham - Digital Literacy for Marginalised Children

- Partner: SIEMENS Healthineers
- Reach/Beneficiaries: 200 marginalized youth and children
- Aid: 5 remedial education centers equipped with 4 computer systems, projector, screen and 4G Hotspot devices each
- Location: Delhi and Assam

Intervention: BOSCONET, supported by Siemens Healthineers established computer labs at Shahdara, Seelampur (Delhi) and Umrangso, Oguri, Amguri (Assam) Don Bosco remedial education centers. The trainers conduct foundational computer skills to enable beneficiaries to access resources and opportunities, otherwise unavailable to them.

The gained skills will help them to pursue vocational or higher education courses.

A total of 5 centers were part of the programme 2 in Delhi and 3 in Assam. Each center has been equipped with four computer systems, one projector, one screen and a 4G Hotspot Router. An average of 200 children are benefiting from the programme.



6. Digital Skilling For Enhanced Employability

• Partner: Hansgrohe

Reach/Beneficiaries: 80 vocational-course students

Aid: Computer systems

Location: Walvanda, Maharashtra

Intervention: Don Bosco Technical Institute, Walvanda caters to the vocational education needs of marginalized children from rural and tribal families. Various formal and non-formal technical courses are conducted in the institute and the trainees are supported with placement. Computer literacy is part of the trainings imparted in the institute. Hansgrohe supported the institute by contributing towards purchase of three new computer systems. These will be used to conduct computer education for the students.

7. Mission No Dropouts

- Partner: Don Bosco Mission, Australia
- Reach/Beneficiaries: 5,575 poor children
- Aid: The continuation of education
- Location: Chennai, Kolkata, Dimapur, Guwahati, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Delhi, Goa, Shillong and Tiruchirappalli

Intervention: The COVID-19 pandemic and the lockdowns seriously hampered the education of poor and rural children leading to a significant increase in the school dropout rate due to a loss of livelihood and income for the poor families.

BOSCONET, with support from the Australian Mission, supported the continuation of education and prevented dropping out of school of about 5,575 children of poor and vulnerable families in Chennai, Kolkata, Dimapur, Guwahati, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Delhi, Goa, Shillong, and Tiruchirappalli during the COVID pandemic.

8. Support to Staff of Educational Institutions during the COVID Pandemic

• Partner: Don Bosco Mission, Australia

• Reach: 262 staff

Aid: Salary support during the COVID lock down

Intervention: A total of 262 staff of nine educational institutions in Don Bosco Chennai province received salary support during the COVID lock down when the schools were closed. The target schools are situated in rural location and tribal belts and are dependent on the fee collection from the students for salary and other maintenance.

Since, the fee collection drastically came down, the teaching and other staff had to be supported with salary to maintain their family. With the funding support of Don Bosco Mission, Australia, Don Bosco Network-Bosconet extended the support for the staff salary.

9. Bringing Youth back to Agriculture

• Partner: Don Bosco Mission, Australia

• Reach: 160+ rural poor youth

 Aid: Compliance of the minimum requirement as per the National Agricultural Education Accreditation Board

· Location: Sulcorna, Goa

Intervention: Youth have the potential to transform farming into a science- and knowledge-based enterprise. Don Bosco College of Agriculture in Sulcorna, Goa is contributing in bringing youth back to agriculture in Compliance of the minimum requirement as per the National Agricultural Education Accreditation Board (NAEAB). Incorporating the minimum requirements is in progress in the Don Bosco College of Agriculture in Sulcorna, with the thankful funding support of Don Bosco Mission, Australia. Total beneficiaries will be 160+ rural poor youth



Scholarships towards Enabling Better, Brighter Future

Partner: SonyReach: 10 boysAid: Scholarships

Location: Borivali, West Mumbai

Intervention: Bosco Boys Home, Borivali, West Mumbai is a child-care institution serving 'children in need of care'. The boys living in the home come from adverse circumstances and often their academic age is behind their biological age.

Due to the deficits in learning, special classes are conducted to bridge the learning gaps. Sony supported the education of 10 boys in the institute for one-year.

Partner: B/S/HReach: 10 girlsAid: Scholarships

Location: Palam, Delhi

Intervention: Living under the Palam Bridge in Delhi is an entire displaced community who lost their homes in a slum demolition drive. Children, especially girls live under highly vulnerable circumstances. Don Bosco Network-Bosconet has been conducting remedial education classes for the children of the community and mainstreaming them. BSH generously contributed to fund the education of 10 girl children from the community for one-year.

Partner: Hitachi

Reach: 94 young girls from low-income families

Aid: ScholarshipsLocation: Hyderabad

Intervention: Hitachi supported BOSCONET with scholarships for girl students of Don Bosco School, Wyra; Don Bosco Junior College, Chandur; Don Bosco School, Mariapuram; Don Bosco Prema Seva Sadan, Hayathnagar; Bosco Seva Kendra, Hyderabad.



• Partner: IndiaFirst Insurance

Reach: 55 girlsAid: Scholarships

• Location: Delhi, Assam, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh

and Telangana.

Intervention: Girls from low-income families were the worst affected by COVID-19 induced school closures. As livelihoods got destroyed, vulnerable families were pulling out their children from schools.

To prevent school dropouts among girl children, IndiaFirst Insurance provided scholarships to cover the educational expenses of 55 vulnerable girls for one-year. The identified girls came from marginalized households in Delhi, Assam, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.

Enhancing Employability through Skill Training

Partner: Hitachi VantaraReach/Beneficiaries: 20

Aid: Vocational-skills Training

Location: Gagillapuram, Hyderabad.

Intervention: 20 young women from low-income families are being supported to gain a sustainable livelihood for themselves. Vocational-skills based training in tailoring (10) and beautician courses (10) are being provided at Don Bosco Human Resource Development Center (DBHRDC), Gagillapuram with the support from Hitachi Vantara.

At the completion of training, the beneficiaries will be provided with initial support in the form of tailoring machines and beautician equipment. Post-training assistance will be available to help the women set up their own micro business or get jobs in tailoring shops and beauty salons.



2. Economic Empowerment through Micro-business Activities

Partner: IndoStar

Reach/Beneficiaries: 75 Rural womenAid: Livelihood Training, Input support

Location: Karnal district, Haryana



Intervention: Rural women in Karnal district, Haryana underwent SHG capacity-building trainings and livelihood training in producing organic kitchen garden products. 75 women were mobilized from three villages- Budhakhera, Daniyalpur and Mugalmajra, after restrictions were lifted.

In phase 1- group dynamics training; finance management training and credit-linkage trainings were conducted for the beneficiaries.

In phase 2- women were taught how to cultivate organically grown products in their own backyard. Theoretical classes and multiple practical demonstrations were carried out in three modules.

Currently, 55 women have set up OKGs and are using the produce for self-consumption, leading to savings on household food expenditure and improved nutritional outcomes for children.



3. Women Empowerment through Livelihood and Entrepreneurship (WELiVE)

Partner: HSBC

Reach/Beneficiaries: 200 rural womenAid: Livelihood Training, Input Support

Location: Four districts of Karnataka-Devangare,

Chitraduraga, Bellary and Yadgir



Intervention: The programme was implemented in four districts of Karnataka-Devangare, Chitraduraga, Bellary and Yadgir. 200 rural women from BPL households were mobilized through focus group discussions.

Two capacity building workshops were conducted- Workshop 1 covered group dynamism, conflict management, finance management, credit linkage among others. Workshop 2 was a 5-days intensive training on sheep farming.

The training was carried out in lecture mode, practical demonstrations and field visits. 200 beneficiaries received 2-3 sheep each and input support in form of cattle insurance, medicines, fodder among other things.

All the beneficiaries are successfully engaged in sheep farming and have made an average profit of Rs. 15,000/-, part of which has been reinvested to purchase new lambs.



4. Sui Dhaga-Empowering Women through skill training in tailoring

Partner: Bosco Seva Kendra and Siddhantham Tollway
 Private Limited – a part of Safeway Concessions Pvt. Ltd

• Reach/Beneficiaries: 50 women

Aid: Tailoring skills

• Location: Ravulapalem, Andhra Pradesh



Intervention: Bosconet in collaboration with Bosco Seva Kendra and Siddhantham Tollway Private Limited – a part of Safeway Concessions Pvt. Ltd., initiated the program 'Sui Dhaga – Empowering Women' in November, 2021. The initiative provides vocational-skills based training in tailoring to young women. This programme supports and empowers women from marginalized and vulnerable backgrounds towards a brighter future.

The women live in the Salesian Surakshita Home located in Ravulapalem, Andhra Pradesh and are survivors of domestic abuse or have been abandoned by their families.



BUILDING THE CAPACITY OF NETWORK PARTNERS

One of the prime tasks of Bosconet is to build the capabilities of the network partners in various means for the Don Bosco Network India. This vision in turn enables the accumulation of aid to various communities in various capacities. The marginalized are given know-how, the sidelined and forgotten are supported with the power of information:

1. Building the Capacity of Civil Society Organizations across the Country

- Partner: Don Bosco Network and BMZ, Germany
- Beneficiaries: 675,000 marginalized people, 720 civil society organizations (CSO's)
- Aid: Capacity-building of staff of CSOs and awareness to the poor people empowering them with information about their rightful welfare schemes and entitlements

Intervention: BOSCONET has been involved in organizing a series of workshops to equip CSOs to promote awareness of government welfare schemes among the people.

The programme empowers at least 67,500 people with information regarding entitlements and government schemes that they are eligible for and also builds the capacity of 720 CSOs on five skills that are essential for advocacy on behalf of the poor, marginalized and weaker sections of people.

2. Write for the Good - building the capacity of Program Development Office (PDO'S)

- Partner: Bosconet
- Reach/Beneficiaries: 20 staff from 8 PDO's (Program Development Offices)

Intervention: BOSCONET planned and executed a capacity-building program for the Don Bosco PDO staff entitled "Write for the Good" – a practical exercise-oriented workshop on how to write winning fundraising proposals.

Twenty staff from the 8 Planning and Development Offices (PDO's) across the country completed participation in the effective and highly successful training programme on the practical skills of proposal writing that included topics - Stakeholder analysis and engagement strategies; the components of and how to develop a Logframe matrix; Various types of activity schedule; Monitoring and evaluation plan; Budget development and important considerations while preparing a budget; basics of Theory of Change (ToC), important issues in report writing.

All of these topics were delivered as practical exercises and at the end of the nine-day workshop, each group was able to develop a full proposal". The 3 modules of the 'Write for the good capacity building program were designed and implemented by Mr. Louis Manohar, the National Coordinator of Don Bosco Network India with assistance from his team.





3. Tech for Good - A Leadership Seminar

- Partner: Bosconet
- Reach/Beneficiaries: India Network Partners

Intervention: Don Bosco Network organised Tech for Good—a two-day workshop in December 2021 in Hyderabad—for the Directors and representatives of the Planning and Development Offices (PDOs) of Don Bosco India. Informative, engaging and challenging sessions communicated why, how, and where the Don Bosco Network can use technology to bolster and multiply the effects of the good being done across India through the network.

The sessions were focused along the lines of using technology for project management and resource mobilisation, providing valuable insights and data points to stimulate the leaders of Don Bosco India's development work to think differently to adapt to the new world situation.



SUPPORTING THE MIGRANT COMMUNITY

4. Building Knowledge and Capacities for Informed Decisions

• Partner: Jugend Eine Welt

 Reach: 6,250 migrant workers; 1,150 migrant workers' families

 Aid: Migrant help desks information about their legal protection and entitlements

• Location: Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, and Tamil Nadu

Intervention: We witnessed the sufferings of the migrant workers during the covid-19 lockdown. All the protective measures entitled to them by various laws were floated by taking advantage of the migrant workers' ignorance, lack of awareness, and their weaker position.

BOSCONET empowered about 6,250 migrant workers in Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, and Tamil Nadu states by educating them about their legal entitlements and protective measures ensured under various laws of this country.

This we possible with the benevolent support of Jugend Eine Welt.

- Three migrant help desks were created in Hyderabad, Kerala, and Chennai, where the migrant workers can get assistance and other support to ensure preventing exploitation.
- About 6,250 migrant workers were informed about their legal protection and entitlements. A
 resource document (softy copy) was developed articulating the various protective laws, entitlements,
 and channels of approach and shared with these migrant workers which is a permanent source
 of reference.
- Thirty cases of migrant workers grievances were taken up by the legal team and redressed.
- During the COVID-19 second wave, about 1,150 migrant workers' families received emergency food ration.



5. Rights and Dignity for every migrant worker

- Partner: Bombay Salesian Society Don Bosco Mission, Australia
- Reach: Migrant workers
- Aid: Health camps for the migrant workers' families, financial literacy to adults, nutrition to the children
- Location: Pune, Vadodara, New Mumbai, Nashik, Ahmednagar and Mumbai

Intervention: Migrant workers who end up at the destination often lack proper shelter, access to education, healthcare and nutrition, knowledge to access their entitlements, etc.

BOSCONET, partnering with the Bombay Salesian Society, supported by the Don Bosco Mission, Australia executed a holistic program for the migrant workers' families in Pune, Vadodara, New Mumbai, Nashik, Ahmednagar, and Mumbai.

This includes health camps for the migrant workers' families, financial literacy to adults, nutrition to the children in the migrant workers' families, and promoting awareness about prevention of exploitation.



Caring for our common home - Planet Earth

Promoting life in productive harmony with nature by promoting sustainable choices through awareness drives and educational measures, skill training and partnerships.















1. Greening Campuses

· Partner: Marelli

• Reach/Beneficiaries: Pastor Lenssen College

Aid: 25kW solar plant, reduction in electricity charges

Location: Kuthenkuly, Tamil Nadu

Intervention: Pastor Lenssen College, Kuthenkuly has been at the forefront in providing affordable higher education to youth from deprived coastal families in Tamil Nadu. With support of Marelli, the institute was able to install 25kW solar plant in its campus.

The solar plant was commissioned in February 2022. The subsequent reduction in electricity charges would aid the institute in subsidizing the education of the needy and additionally reduce its carbon footprint.



2. Clean Water, Clean Body

• Partner: GIVE India

Reach/Beneficiaries: Frontline workers, healthcare centre patrons

Aid: Clean drinking water

Location: Jharkhand

Intervention: Intervention: Don Bosco Network-Bosconet along with Give India, collaborated with Xavier Institute of Social Service (XISS) to implement the project of installation of RO purifiers at various health centers of the selected 16 district health centers. 5 centers from Nawadih Block of Bokaro district and 11 health centers from the Dumri Block of Giridih district were identified and finalized for the implementation of the programme. The team from XISS monitored the process throughout.

The installation work was done in two-phases which included infrastructural work and then installation work.

3. Improving Livelihood Outcomes through Tree Plantation

Partner: UPS Foundation

• Reach/Beneficiaries: 16 tribal households

Aid: Setting up fruit tree orchards

Location: Palghar district, Maharshtra

Intervention: Marginalized households in Palghar district live in penury. Therefore, it is essential that they are able to produce and sell products that can generate adequate income. To this end, BOSCONET with support from UPS Foundation is helping 16 women in setting up fruit tree orchards in unused land. Each woman is being supported to establish 0.5 acres each of orchard.

With a 30% contribution from the households, plots have been levelled and bore wells have been dug. Drip-irrigation facilities have been set up and saplings (25 mango trees and 15 cashew trees) per plot were planted.



Green Energy

1. Solar Energy for partner organizations

Partner: Jugend Eine Welt

 Aid: Reduction of about 58.92 tons of carbon dioxide per year + savings in electricity charges

· Location: Dwarka, Delhi

Intervention: BOSCONET has installed 45KWP solar power unit at SPCI House, Dwarka, Delhi with the funding support of Jugend Eine Welt, contributing towards reduction of about 58.92 tons of carbon dioxide per year and savings in electricity charges. BOSCONET is currently taking the initiative to promote solar energy in the various institutions of its partner organizations across India.

2. Solar Power in the North-East States

• Partner: Don Bosco Mission, Australia

• Aid: Production of 335 WP of solar power

Location: Meghalaya and Assam

Intervention: BOSCONET in partnership with the Don Bosco Salesian Province of Guwahati, Assam and funding assistance from Don Bosco Mission, Australia, is engaged in installing solar power panels at Holy Family Church, Rongjeng, Meghalaya; Bosco Mount, Tura, Meghalaya; Catholic Church, Tangla, Assam; Don Bosco, Baithalangso, Assam; Catholic Church, Bengtol, Assam; and Don Bosco, Bongaigaon, Assam. It is estimated that a total of 335 WP of solar power will be produced.



3. Lighting Educational Labs through Solar Energy

Partner: Don Bosco Youth Centre

• Reach/Beneficiaries: 1,400 marginalized youth

 Aid: Job-oriented skill training, animation, solar power 100 KW solar power units

Location: Kerala

Intervention: Don Bosco Youth Centre at Vaduthala, Kerala is reaching nearly 1,400 marginalized youth by providing education, job-oriented skill training and animation. Work is in progress for the installation of 100 KW solar power units. The solar power modules, as a renewable and eco-friendly source of sustained energy, will contribute in mitigating the carbon footprint and result in reducing the cost of conventional electricity supply.

4. Solar Energy for youth centres

Partner: Don Bosco Youth Centre

Reach/Beneficiaries: 1,400 marginalized youth

 Aid: 340 WP solar power job-oriented skill training, and animation, sustained energy

Location: Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh and Odisha

Intervention: The three centres, Don Bosco YuvaSadan, Jabalpur in Madhya Pradesh; Don Bosco Centre, Keerent in Jharkhand; and Don Bosco Yuva Kendra, Jharsuguda in Odisha are situated in rural areas and are catering to the holistic development of youth. The installation of 340 WP solar power models will help during the frequent power supply breaks as these are rural locations, and will ensure a significant saving in the power cost of regular electricity power supply.

Responding to Disasters

The second wave of the COVID pandemic brought about a renewed sense of commitment to BOSCONET's CARE Intervention- COVID-19 Action and Relief Efforts. Amidst support activities, BOSCONET partnered with various corporate houses and organizations to provide aid to the those that needed it in the form of Dry rations, Home isolation Care Kits and Oxygen Concentrators; Health and Hygiene Kits; Medical Kits, Tele-Counseling Helpline.

Assistance was also given in the way of Safeguarding and Supporting Frontline Workers. Migrant workers were provided with mental health and informational support in the form of tele-counselling and help lines, set up across the country to facilitate a process of reaching out to this marginalized group of individuals.
