



Don Bosco Network cares for and promotes quality education to marginalised children and youth to foster new beginnings through a series of collaborations and support from different partners for various concerns.

1. PROMOTION OF SPORTS (HOCKEY) IN RURAL AREAS OF WEST BENGAL

PARTNER

PwC Service Delivery Center Kolkata Pvt Ltd

BENEFICIARIES:

34 players

- 14 junior-level hockey players (under 19 years)
- 20 sub-junior level hockey players (under 16 years)

LOCATION: Tangra, Kolkata



ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED:

- Preparation of the hockey turf
- Formation of teams
- Practice sessions
- · Levelling of the hockey turf
- Participation in state-level competitions
- Organising competitions



OUTCOME:

- Achieved the Runner-up position in the "Jawaharlal Nehru Hockey Tournament, 2023" through the combined efforts of Junior and Sub-Junior Teams.
- ARKODYUTI MONDAL received the Golden Glove for Best Goalkeeper in the Jawaharlal Nehru Hockey Tournament, 2023.
- 6 players participated in the 67th National School Games Hockey Championship, representing Bengal in the U/17 and U/14 categories.
- Winners of the Bosco Challenge Cup among Don Bosco Youth Centre, Don Bosco High School, and the Hockey Nadia team.
- Individual awards in the Bosco Challenge Cup:

Best Player of the Tournament: Simon Soren

Best Goalkeeper: Arian Biswas

Best Scorer: Sudip Mullick (Hockey Nadia team) with a total of four goals.

- The structured training program fostered a nurturing environment for talent development.
- Regular practice sessions enhanced skill levels for both teams.
- Infrastructure improvements, including the levelling of the hockey turf and grass planting, ensured readiness for matches.



2. MISSION EVERY GIRL IN SCHOOL

PARTNER

Give Foundation

BENEFICIARIES

71 girl children (aged 8 to 18) from economically disadvantaged families at risk of dropping out of school due to lack of essential school supplies.

LOCATION

- East Jaintia Hills, Meghalaya
- Eastern West Khasi Hills, Meghalaya
- West Jaintia Hills, Meghalaya
- West Khasi Hills, Meghalaya



ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Distribution of educational kits to 71 girl children, including School bag, Lunch box, Lunch bag, Water bottle, Pen, pencil, eraser, sharpener, Multiplication book, Origami paper, Clipboard, Cursive writing book, Drawing book, drawing colours, GK for children, Sketch pencil, sketchbook, Maths book, Ruled copy, unruled copy.
- Counselling sessions for girl children and their parents
- Meetings with school teachers
- Home visits
- Tracking academic progress



OUTCOME

- All 71 girls now have essential stationery and supplies, encouraging them to stay enrolled in school.
- The average cost incurred per beneficiary per month is ₹440.
- 56 girls were promoted to the next grade during the last academic year.
- Increased school attendance among the enrolled girls.
- Distribution of supplies and home visits in remote areas addressed the root causes of girls dropping out of school.
- The provision of required materials through Give Foundation's funding ensures that young girls can afford the necessary supplies for their education, supporting their academic progress and reducing dropout rates.





3. MISSION NO CHILD HOMELESS

PARTNER

Give Foundation

BENEFICIARIES

63 boys (aged 9 to 17) at risk and in need of care and protection from underprivileged and vulnerable backgrounds.

LOCATION

Mumbai, Maharashtra, India

OUTCOME

- Distributed school stationery, school bags, books, and shoes to 63 boys.
- Provided life skills training, education support, nutrition, and healthcare facilities to the 63 enrolled children.
- All 63 boys are now enrolled in English medium regular and open schools.

4. MISSION NO CHILD HUNGRY

PARTNER

Give Foundation

BENEFICIARIES

19 boys, and homeless children (aged 5 to 18), including children dependent on institutional care as per the rules of CWC.

LOCATION Shillong, Meghalaya

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Provided 4 nutritious meals a day
- Distributed dry rations
- Conducted health check-ups
- Offered life skills training
- Provided counselling services

OUTCOME

- 19 homeless children at Rilang Children's Home now enjoy nutritious meals.
- Served 4 meals a day to the 19 beneficiaries, including a variety of foods such as rice, eggs, dal, fish, pasta, bread, cornflakes, chicken, meat, chana, rajma, vegetables, sweets, papad, and salad.
- Regular distribution of dry rations ensures the sustainability of the food program.
- Body mass index (BMI) is calculated twice a year to monitor health.
- Improved nutrition and overall well-being for homeless children at Rilang Children's Home.

5. EDUCATIONAL REHABILITATION FOR GIRL CHILDREN FROM LOW-INCOME FAMILIES

PARTNER Avekshaa Technologies Pvt. Ltd.

BENEFICIARIES 25 girls from vulnerable and marginalised families

LOCATION Bengaluru, Karnataka

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Sponsorship of uniforms
- Provision of school bags
- Supply of books and stationery
- Arranged private tutors for 25
 girl children

OUTCOME

- 25 girl children received quality education through remedial classes.
- Financial assistance was provided for uniforms, school bags, books, stationery, and private tutors.
- The average annual cost per beneficiary is ₹8,800.
- The girls received support and motivation to complete at least their high school education (10th grade).
- Active participation of the girls in school events and competitions.





6. REMEDIAL EDUCATION AND DEVELOPMENT (READ)

PARTNER

PwC Service Delivery Center Kolkata Pvt Ltd

BENEFICIARIES

Children from underprivileged, vulnerable, and marginalised communities

- 450 children from Kolkata
- 400 children from Bengaluru

LOCATION Tangra, Kolkata and Bengaluru, Karnataka



ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Remedial education classes
- Child rights training sessions
- Supplementary nutritional food distribution (Kolkata) / Weekly nutrition program (Bengaluru)
- Special classes in drawing, singing, storytelling, art, craft, and wealth from waste (Bengaluru)
- Empowering Minds classes
 (Kolkata)





OUTCOME

- Zero school dropouts and no reported cases of child labour in both locations
- Over 80% of children showed improvement in grades in both Kolkata and Bengaluru
- 100% of children in Kolkata and 95% in Bengaluru became familiar with their basic rights
- Regular classes and supplementary nutrition programs supported consistent school attendance and better academic performance
- Competitions, cultural events, and special observances in Kolkata boosted children's confidence and showcased their talents
- Regular Child Rights classes empowered children to understand their rights and identify various forms of abuse, fostering their ability to advocate against injustices.
- Children from marginalised backgrounds, facing challenges such as inadequate meals, benefited significantly from the READ initiative, enabling them to attend tuition centres consistently and pursue their educational aspirations.
- PwC volunteers played a crucial role in enhancing the mathematical skills of eighth-grade students.
- Competitions, cultural events, and special day observances boosted children's confidence, showcased their talents, and imparted important values.
- Consistent distribution of Supplementary Nutrition ensured that families did not compromise on their children's health, addressing nutritional needs that would otherwise be challenging for them to meet.



7. SEEP (SUPPORTIVE EDUCATION AND EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM)

BENEFICIARIES Total: 1,967 children

LOCATION

- Palghar, Maharashtra

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

Remedial Education:

 Provided remedial education to 1,967 children (ages 6 to 16) from marginalised households in Palghar, Maharashtra, and Ramnathapuram, Tamil Nadu.

Child Rights and Life Skills Training:

- Conducted 320 sessions across Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu.
- Formed and capacitated 64 Children's Parliaments, with each club making representations to government offices and schools regarding local issues.

Teachers' Trainings and Meetings:

• Conducted five teacher trainings and nine monthly meetings in both Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu.

Parents Meetings and Home Visits:

• Engaged parents through meetings and home visits to enhance their involvement in their children's education.

OUTCOME

Education Impact:

- Zero dropout rate observed.
- More than 80% of children showed improvement over baseline academic assessments.
- Increased classroom confidence and interaction from 30% to 60% among students.

Child Rights and Life Skills:

- 1967 children trained in basic child rights, child abuse awareness, POCSO Act, and life skills.
- Nearly 90% of children are now aware of their rights.

Children's Parliament Impact:

 64 Children's Parliaments filed 109 applications to local bodies, resulting in approximately 50% of requests being fulfilled.

Teacher Training Impact:

 All 64 SEEP teachers improved their instructional abilities, shifting towards interactive and activity-based teaching strategies.

• Teachers gained knowledge of child rights, enhancing their approach to education.

Parental Engagement:

 50-60% of parents became more proactive in monitoring their children's education and maintaining regular communication with teachers.

Overall Impact:

- SEEP-supported schools showed improved academic performance compared to neighbouring villages.
- Students demonstrated talents in competitions and developed positive behavioural patterns.
- Successful convergence and collaboration among stakeholders including Children's Parliaments, teachers, parents, school authorities, and local bodies.
- Acknowledgement and appreciation of SET India and Bosconet's support in the educational and developmental progress of children.



8. TRANSFORMING RURAL LIVES: INTEGRATED RURAL DEVELOPMENT IN IDENTIFIED VILLAGES IN TAMIL NADU

BENEFICIARIES Over 3,000 People

LOCATION Elaimbedu & Kattavur Villages, Ponneri Block, Chennai



ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Educational Support: Provided essential resources and learning opportunities to students.
- Infrastructure Development: Improved essential infrastructure by constructing and renovating.
- Enhancing Community Harmony and Engagement: Fostered a sense of unity and cooperation among villagers.



OUTCOME

The Village Adoption Project with Give Foundation has resulted in the holistic integrated development of Elaimbedu and Kattavur Villages. The concerted efforts in education, skill development, healthcare, livelihood enhancement, and infrastructure improvements have significantly uplifted the living standards of over 3,000 residents. The initiatives have not only empowered individuals but also strengthened the community's self-sufficiency and resilience, paving the way for sustainable growth and harmony.



9. ACADEMIC SUPPORT FOR THE UNDERPRIVILEGED

PARTNER

Freundeskreis Wider Vision Foundation, Germany, Bosconet

BENEFICIARIES

77 boys and girls from financially weak families in Varanasi.

LOCATION

Varanasi

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Short Meditation Sessions: Continued to benefit children, helping them feel calmer and more focused.
- Creative Arts: Daily activities include drawing, colouring, and singing songs in Hindi and English, enriching the children's experience at Naveen School.
- Gardening: Participation in caring for the school garden and common areas, fostering a sense of belonging and responsibility.
- Teacher Training Program (February 2024):

Teachers participated in a hands-on Teacher Training Program focused on teaching methods in English.

• Implementation of New Techniques: Teachers are now using these methods in their classrooms, enhancing the learning experience for the children.





OUTCOME

Despite the financial hardships faced by both students' families and teaching staff, the School remained committed to providing quality education and a nurturing environment for the students. The school's efforts in introducing experiential activities helped the children find joy and overcome the stress of the past years. By offering support and appreciation to the teachers, the school fostered a positive and encouraging atmosphere for both students and staff.





10. EDUCATION SUPPORT FOR THE UNDERPRIVILEGED

BENEFICIARIES

LOCATION

- Meghalaya (Don Bosco Higher Secondary School Smit)
- Mizoram (Don Bosco School Thenzwal)
- Tripura (Don Bosco School, Pitra)

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Provided scholarships to students from nursery to class XII based on their financial needs.
- Distributed scholarship amounts, ranging from ₹2,570 to ₹5,610 depending on class and requirements.

OUTCOME

- Enabled 64 poor students in Don Bosco Higher Secondary School Smit to continue their education. Notable beneficiaries include:
- Denysius Sohkhlet: A 15-year-old orphan who lost his parents to mushroom poisoning. The scholarship ensured continuation of his studies.
- Philawankmen Kharmaliki: Supported by a single mother, the scholarship was critical for her and her sister's education.
- Assisted 102 students in Don Bosco School Thenzwal. Notable beneficiaries include:
- Carola Zununmwii and R. Lathruaitluangi: Both are from poor families and are supported only by their mothers. The scholarship was essential for their continued education.
- Supported 101 students in Don Bosco School, Pitra. Notable beneficiaries include:
- Bikash Debbarma and Sunil Molson: Both come from poor family backgrounds and the scholarship motivated them to continue their studies, aiming for a successful future.



11. EDUCATION AND LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT FOR UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN AND FAMILIES IN DELHI

40 children of Homeless Families Under the Palam Flyover, Education & Livelihood for Naresh Shah Family

LOCATION Don Bosco Ashalayam, Delhi

OUTCOME:

Shah Family:

- Jyoti Shah: Successfully transitioned from education to employment, married.
- **Priya Shah:** Balances academic studies with employment, shows commitment to personal and professional development.
- Manish Shah: Completed essential courses, planning further studies and career development.

Children of Homeless Families:

- Children successfully moved from informal labour to regular schooling, demonstrating improved engagement and academic progress.
- The combination of academic support, extracurricular activities, and festival celebrations contributed to well-rounded development and social integration of the children.
- Provision of rations has encouraged consistent attendance and strengthened the connection between the study centre and the families.



ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Helping Mr. Naresh Shah's three older children— Jyoti (22), Priya (20), and Manish (18) access better educational and career opportunities.
- Supporting around 40 children from poor families residing under the Palam flyover to enhance their academic performance and overall well-being.
- Transition from informal work to mainstream education through the Bridge School Program.
- Daily academic and personal support at the Ashalayam Study Centre, including hygiene, homework, and leisure activities.
- Participation in extracurricular activities to enrich talents and personal growth.
- Celebration of a variety of traditional and personal events.
- Rations to the families of children attending the centre regularly.





12. SCHOLARSHIP AID FOR CHILDREN IN KARNATAKA

PARTNER

Jugend Eine Welt

BENEFICIARIES 28 Children aged 5 to 21

LOCATION Karnataka

OUTCOME

- The scholarship program successfully provided financial assistance to 28 students, enabling them to continue their education without financial hindrance.
- The end-of-year event fostered a meaningful connection between students and their sponsors, creating a platform for personal interaction and mutual appreciation.
- Students had the opportunity to enhance their communication skills and gain confidence by hosting the event.

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

Scholarship Distribution:

- Scholarships were awarded to deserving students aged 5 to 21 based on a thorough assessment of their parents' economic backgrounds.
- Each selected student received Rs. 20,000 through Bosconet.

Scholarship Awards for 2023-24:

• A total of 28 students were granted scholarships for the 2023-24 academic year.

End-of-Year Event:

• At the end of the academic year, a small event was organized virtually to provide students an opportunity to meet and thank their sponsors.

1. EMPOWERING WITH EDUCATION FOR MISSION-DRIVEN IMPACT

IMPLEMENTING PARTNER:

Visitation Sisters of Don Bosco (VSDB)

BENEFICIARIES:

• VSDB sisters pursuing higher education and new candidates for the academic year 2024-2025

LOCATION: Villages and neglected urban areas

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED:

- Educational Fees Payment: Covered the fees for VSDB sisters enrolled in various studies and formation courses, ensuring they have the financial support needed to pursue higher education and specialised training.
- Support for New Candidates: Extended financial and academic support to new candidates, enabling them to join and benefit from the educational and formation programs offered by the VSDB.

OUTCOME:

The project successfully facilitated the higher education and professional training of VSDB sisters, equipping them with the knowledge and skills necessary to continue their mission work effectively. The well-trained sisters significantly enhanced the quality of life for villagers, contributing to their human, psychological, social, spiritual, and mental development. This initiative not only strengthens the immediate community but also ensures the long-term impact and reach of the VSDB's mission-driven activities.



2. EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT FOR TRIBAL STUDENTS AT DON BOSCO CENTRE, KUNKURI, CHHATTISGARH



IMPLEMENTING PARTNER:

Bosco Delhi

BENEFICIARIES: Don Bosco Higher Secondary 25 Tribal Students

LOCATION

Kunkuri, Chhattisgarh

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Provision of Stationery Items: Distributed essential academic supplies, including notebooks, pens, pencils, and erasers.
- Supply of Books: Provided necessary textbooks and reference materials to aid in the students' studies across various subjects.
- Uniform Distribution: Ensured that students had proper uniforms, enhancing their sense of identity and belonging.
- Tuition Fee Coverage: Covered the tuition fees to facilitate uninterrupted education for the students.
- School Bags: Supplied durable school bags for students to carry their educational materials safely.



OUTCOME

The educational support initiative at Don Bosco Centre, Kunkuri, Chhattisgarh, has significantly impacted the lives of the 25 tribal students and their families. By receiving comprehensive educational resources, these students are now better equipped to engage actively in their studies, crucial for their academic progress and future opportunities. The provision of uniforms and school bags has boosted their morale, instilling a sense of pride and ownership in their education. The project, driven by the dedication of Salesian Father Joe D'Souza and supported by generous donors, marks a milestone in empowering tribal students through education. It offers them hope and a pathway to a brighter future, fostering a ripple effect that empowers these individuals to become agents of change within their communities.

LOCATION: 11 Educational Rehabilitation Centres in Kolkat

3. PROJECT ASHA SISHU SHIKHA



ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED:

Thematic Education Workshop for Educators

- Participants: ASSP Educators
- Details: The workshop started with a welcome address by DBA Director Fr. Dr. George Chempakathinal and was conducted by Alok Chaudhuri. It focused on key skills required for effective teaching, such as discipline, classroom management, observation, communication, lesson planning, time management, and patience. The interactive session aimed to revisit these skills in the context of the post-pandemic situation to explore practical steps for managing remedial education centres effectively.

Child Rights Training Programme

- Participants: Students of eleven Educational Rehabilitation Centres
- Details: Don Bosco Ashalayam organised the training with assistance from District Childline. Topics covered included child protection, hygiene, and the importance of education. Activities included discussions on good and bad touch, support systems, the right to education, identity, play, and social security. The training also included games and action songs to engage the children.

Parents Meeting

- Participants: Parents of children studying at the eleven Educational Rehabilitation Centres
- Details: The meeting aimed to inform parents about child protection, hygiene, immunisation, government schemes, and the importance of regular school attendance. The meeting was organised with inputs from District Childline and saw good participation from parents, who abstained from work to attend.

Educational Materials Distribution

- Participants: Children at the eleven ASSP Centres
- Details: Educational materials such as books, slates, colour pencils, and drawing books were distributed. The distribution took place during school hours and was well-received by the children.

Life Skills Training Programme

- Participants: Students of eleven Educational Rehabilitation Centres
- Details: The training focused on essential life skills, including health and hygiene, time management, money management, cleaning, getting dressed, maintaining clean surroundings, clear communication, and action songs. The sessions were conducted by Miss Sujana Egnesh, a resource person from Ashalayam.

OUTCOME:

Educator Skills Enhancement: Educators revisited and enhanced their teaching skills, ensuring a better learning environment for children.

Child Awareness and Participation: Children were educated about their rights, hygiene, and the importance of education, leading to increased awareness and participation.

Parental Involvement:

Parents became more involved in their children's education, understanding the importance of regular attendance and hygiene.

Provision of Educational Materials: Children received essential educational materials, which contributed to a more effective learning process.

Life Skills Development: Children learned vital life skills, equipping them to face daily challenges effectively.



4. EDUCATION FOR UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN

IMPLEMENTING PARTNER Don Bosco Ashalayam, Delhi

BENEFICIARIES

52 families and 195 children living on the streets of Palam Village

LOCATION

Don Bosco Ashalayam, Palam Village, South West Delhi



ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Educational Support: Provided stationery items such as pens, pencils, bags, and notebooks to children.
- Enrollment Assistance: Enrolled children in government schools and registered them for Aadhaar cards, bank accounts, and other essential services through government portals.
- Health and Hygiene: Organised various activities, sessions, and games to promote health and hygiene among the children.

OUTCOME

The Don Bosco Ashalayam team, with support from Bosconet, has successfully supported 195 children in Palam Village. The children have received educational materials and been enrolled in government schools, improving their access to education and essential services. Regular health and hygiene activities have been conducted, ensuring the well-being of these children. The team will continue to provide support for the children's education and development, working towards a brighter future.





SKILLING FOR SUSTAINABLE LIVING



Promoting opportunities for the well-being of young people by actively implementing programmes to enable youth with technical skills to become self-reliant and productive citizens.

1. SKILL TRAINING FOR MARGINALISED YOUTH AND WOMEN

- Inception Workshop: Organised by Bosconet on November 3rd and 4th, 2023, with participation from Executive Directors and key staff of six regional partner organisations (Guwahati, Hyderabad, Goa, Mumbai, Chennai, and Trichy).
- Feasibility Study: Conducted by a three-member (all-women) expert team to assess the current state and provide recommendations to enhance the performance of elected women panchayat representatives.
- Project Overview and Methodology: Discussions included the local governance framework, the rationale behind the project, and the methodology of the feasibility study.



OUTCOME:

The WELEAD project,

conceptualised by Bosconet, aims to empower elected women panchayat leaders and members to become effective decision-makers and leaders, countering the trend of women leaders functioning as proxies. The inception workshop provided a comprehensive understanding of the project's framework and goals, engaging key stakeholders from six regional partner organisations. The expert team's feasibility study offered valuable insights and suggestions to improve the performance of elected women representatives. With the project's approval and direct monitoring by Don Bosco Mondo, Germany, WELEAD is set to impact at least 600 elected women representatives, 120 civil society organisations, 600 women self-help groups, and approximately 24,000 rural residents. This initiative promises to foster leadership, enhance governance, and drive sustainable development in rural communities.


SPARKING SUSTAINABILITY: WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY CELEBRATION

OUTCOME:

The dry ration kits provided sustenance for 538 families for 2-3 weeks.

700 individuals received durable blankets ensuring protection from cold for several years.

Approximately 40,000 individuals from 8,000 families received dry ration kits sufficient for 1 week.

OUTCOME

The Trichy Don Bosco Society, with the aid of Bosconet and donations from various organisations,

successfully provided flood relief to the affected areas. Essential goods were distributed to those in need, despite the logistical challenges. The project utilised approximately Rs. 10,000 per day over fifteen days to ensure timely delivery of aid, significantly benefiting the flood-affected communities.



2. RELIEF ACTIVITIES FOR MANIPUR VIOLENCE AFFECTED

Manipur (Imphal, Churachandpur, Kangkokpi, Moreh, Tengnopal, Ukhrul, Senapati, Noney, Bishnupur, Imphal East, Imphal West, Kakching, Thoubal)

OUTCOME:

The relief efforts, funded by Bosconet, provided essential supplies and support to over 58,357 people affected by the Manipur violence. AIDA successfully delivered dry rations, home essentials, and educational materials to multiple relief camps, overcoming significant logistical challenges. The project ensured educational continuity for 1,068 students from displaced families, covering tuition fees and providing necessary school supplies. The comprehensive needs assessment conducted by AIDA highlighted the multifaceted challenges faced by the affected communities, underscoring the importance of sustained support. The coordinated efforts between AIDA and Bosconet significantly mitigated the immediate hardships faced by the victims and facilitated their recovery and rehabilitation.

ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- Distribution of dry rations (rice, dal, potatoes, cooking oil, sugar, salt, milk powder) to 57 relief camps in Kangpokpi district
- Provision of home essentials (mattresses, blankets, bed sheets, mosquito nets) and warm clothes (jackets, socks) to relief camps in Tgojan and Molkon villages of Saikhul subdivision
- Supply of 300 blankets to relief camps in Churachandpur district
- Educational support (uniforms, books, notebooks, storybooks, game articles) to students in Methei relief camps in Kachingkhounou villages
- Payment of six months' school tuition fees for 58 students of The Diamond English High School in Kangpokpi
- Psychological and psychiatric support facilitated by professionals





3. DELHI FLOOD RELIEF INITIATIVE

- Extended relief efforts to Mahipalpur slum, distributing ration supplies to another 100 families.
- Aimed to alleviate food insecurity and provide critical support to the most severely affected.





OUTCOME

The Delhi Flood Relief Initiative, spearheaded by BOSCO Delhi with the generous support of BOSCONET, has had a profound impact on the lives of over 200 families devastated by the floods. The timely distribution of essential provisions, including ration kits and cooked meals, addressed the immediate needs of flood-affected individuals, providing much-needed relief and stability during a period of uncertainty and distress. This substantial relief operation was made possible through the collective effort of volunteers and the dedicated partnership with Holy Family Sisters in Burari.

The relief efforts not only provided immediate material assistance but also fostered a sense of solidarity and hope among those affected.

- Setup of Vegetable Garden: Established a rooftop vegetable garden with the support of 11 PWC volunteers and 15 children from Don Bosco Navajeevan.
- Construction: Created a sturdy garden structure with MS pipes, covered with green garden shade nets to enhance the rooftop's visual appeal and durability.
- Planting and Cultivation: Purchased and mixed red mud, manure, cocopeat, and earthworm fertiliser in 40 paint buckets. Planted saplings of vegetables such as tomatoes, country beans, chilli, ridged gourd, ivy gourd, and bitter gourd in these buckets.

4. DBN-SA PDO Network Meetings

Quarterly online meetings were conducted as scheduled, adhering to the agreed-upon timeline of every three months (18 April 2023, 18 July 2023, and 31 October 2023). These meetings served as a platform to address general issues, discuss program needs and priorities, and identify additional support requirements.

INVITING INDIVIDUALS TO PARTNER WITH BOSCONET- DON BOSCO NETWORK

Bosconet actively seeks partnerships with individuals and communities to further our mission. Through public appeals and educational initiatives, we aim to raise funds and awareness, fostering a culture of social responsibility and collective action.

1. PUBLIC APPEALS IN 3 MALLS IN KOLKATA

Bosconet- Don Bosco Network launched successful public appeals in three major malls in Kolkata, engaging with shoppers to raise awareness and funds for our initiatives. The campaigns garnered significant support, reflecting the community's commitment to our cause.

Throughout the year, we hosted a series of engaging events that reached out to a total of 2,060 people, fostering community involvement and support for our initiatives. For World Environment Day, we distributed small saplings to raise environmental awareness. On Independence Day, children from three homes visited Mani Square Mall for a special sit-and-draw event, where they received Indian flags and enjoyed lunch provided by the mall. Our Raksha Bandhan event involved tying Rakhi, and promoting a spirit of camaraderie among recruiters and visitors at Mani Square and Lake Mall.

In October, our DAAN UTSAV encouraged supporters to donate items, bringing festive cheer to vulnerable children. Republic Day featured a memorable visit from Harley Davidson bikers to Don Bosco Ashalayam, where they engaged with the children, participated in activities, and gave goodie bags. International Women's Day was celebrated by male recruiters honouring their female colleagues with chocolates and roses. Lastly, our Holi Celebration embraced the festival of colours, with team members in traditional attire



spreading joy and hope to children in need. These events reflect our ongoing commitment to community engagement and support.

These events not only celebrated various occasions but also fostered a sense of community and support for our cause.

2. EDUCATION FOR SOCIAL GIVING

Through Bosconet- Don Bosco Network's School Fundraising Programs, we educated students on the importance of social giving. These initiatives not only raised funds but also instilled a sense of responsibility and philanthropy among young minds. Our team visited 67 schools in the North-Eastern Regions of India to seek consent for the fundraising programs, successfully conducting 21 programs. These included 12 programs in Don Bosco Institutions and 9 in Non-Don Bosco Institutions, with 16 programs in Dimapur Province and 5 in

Guwahati Province. These sessions aimed to foster a culture of social giving among students, highlighting the impact of their contributions on underprivileged communities.

Despite challenges such as noncontributions after program completion and program cancellations or postponements, our efforts have proven beneficial. By engaging students in these activities, we have not only raised awareness about social responsibility but also encouraged a sense of community involvement and empathy.



NEWSLINES

1. Bright Futures Under the Bridge: Empowering Education for Delhi's Underprivileged

Bosconet aims to improve education and livelihood opportunities for underprivileged children and families. With support from Don Bosco Mondo, the project has provided essential educational and vocational assistance to the Naresh family—Jyoti, Priya, and Manish along with additional support to approximately 40 children living under the Palam flyover in Delhi.

Bosconet's efforts have been transformative: Jyoti, the eldest, completed her Bachelor of Arts and hospitality training, and secured a job at the Hyatt Regency, though she has since married. Priya successfully passed her high school exams, completed multiple vocational



courses, and is pursuing a BA while working part-time. Manish, despite initial academic struggles, has completed his high school and vocational courses and is seeking employment. Additionally, the project has supported street children with educational coaching, nutrition, and various extracurricular activities, significantly enhancing their quality of life and academic prospects.

2. Supporting the Welfare of the Physically Challenged and Aiding the Homeless

Dev Animal Voluntary Organization (DAVO) in New Delhi has been actively supporting the welfare of the homeless and physically challenged individuals. Located near Dwarka Mor Metro Station, DAVO provides essential services such as grooming, nutritious food, clothing, and shelter to people living on the streets. Recently, with the help of





donations amounting to ₹10,658, DAVO purchased and distributed 70 blankets to vulnerable individuals in various areas including Palam, Dwarka, and surrounding J.J. Colonies.

These blankets were aimed at providing warmth and comfort to those enduring harsh weather conditions. The initiative benefited numerous homeless individuals across diverse locations, including Matiala, Sector 3 Dwarka, and several villages and colonies in South West Delhi. The support not only addressed immediate needs but also offered a sense of care and dignity to those affected by homelessness and physical challenges.



IMPACT STORIES

Rohit Thakur is a 9-year-old from Fuleswar, Uluberia. His family struggles on a monthly income of Rs 3500. His father pulls a van, his mother works as a housemaid, and education was once a distant dream for their six children.

Initially reluctant to attend school due to his parents' demanding jobs and limited education, Rohit's story changed when he joined the Educational Rehabilitation Center at Jagannathpur. Centre educators counselled his parents on the importance of education, inspiring Rohit's mother to ensure his regular attendance.

Under the centre's guidance, Rohit discovered a passion for stories, games, and drawing, showing remarkable progress in his studies. The centre's support extended beyond education, providing relief items, clothes, and school supplies to ease the family's financial burden.

Now, preparations are underway for Rohit's formal admission into Class Four. The centre has linked the family to government services and organised awareness programs, ensuring they understand and embrace the value of education.

PROJECT MISSION EVERY GIRL IN SCHOOL

1. In the village of Jalyiah, DahoiDkhar excels at Seinraij RMSA Secondary School despite challenges. Raised by her grandmother, who relies on daily wage labour, Dahoi faces financial hurdles for her education. While she uses school resources, materials at home are scarce.

Through the "Mission Every Girl in School" Project, Dahoi received crucial stationery supplies, transforming her educational experience. Grateful for these tools, she now studies with renewed vigour, empowered to build a brighter future.

2. Raised by her grandmother alongside her orphaned siblings, Gibatti faced significant challenges in accessing education without financial support.

Fortunately, through the "Mission Every Girl in School" Project, Gibatti received essential books and stationery. These resources were more than tools—they were symbols of hope, enabling Gibatti to strengthen her reading and writing skills. Despite hardships, the Sohtyngkhur Morning Community School played a crucial role in Gibatti's education, equipping her with foundational skills and empowering her to aspire for a better future.

When Gibatti first enrolled, she could only recognize and spell letters and identify numbers 1-9, placing her in Grade C. Through unwavering dedication, consistent attendance, and the guidance of her facilitator, she has made remarkable strides. Today, in Grade B, Gibatti reads proficiently, performs 2-digit addition, and actively participates in school activities. Her progress, reflected in her performance in the ASER test, underscores her growing confidence and passion for learning.







PROJECT SPORTS FOR DEVELOPMENT- HOCKEY TRAINING



1. Kuntal Bala, from Sebagram village near Krishnagar town, faces financial challenges despite his father's income as a farmer. With a yearly income of Rs. 60,000, the family struggles to cover Kuntal's Rs. 1,500 monthly tuition.

Despite these obstacles, Kuntal excels in hockey and dance, participating in prestigious competitions across India. However, funding sports equipment, especially for out-of-state tournaments, remains a hurdle.



2. Prokas Hasda, living in Ashadan Para village, faces financial challenges in pursuing his education and passion for hockey. His father, a daily labourer earning Rs. 72,000 annually, struggles to cover expenses including a Rs. 2,500 monthly rent.

Despite these hardships, Prokas excels in hockey, drawing, and computers. He recently participated in the Sub-Junior Bengal InterSchool Hockey Challenge Cup and has been selected for the All India School Hockey National. His dream is to represent the Indian Junior Hockey Team.

PROJECT AVEKSHAA

1. AKSHATHA, a diligent student, comes from a modest background. Her parents, Ravindra and Kavitha, earn a meagre wage, which makes it challenging for them to support Akshatha and her two elder sisters through their studies. Recognizing Akshatha's passion for learning and the family's financial struggles, she was chosen to receive support through a sponsorship program.

Since receiving support, Akshatha's academic progress has shown significant improvement. With financial worries alleviated, she can now focus more on her studies. Additionally, her access to nutritious food has improved, contributing to her growth—she stands at nearly 140 cm tall and weighs around 40 kg.
