

# Development Intervention Impact

## EDUCATION FOR ALL



Don Bosco Network cares for and promotes quality education to marginalised children and youth to foster new beginnings through a series of collaborations and support from different partners for various concerns.

### 01. Delivering Smiles

- **Partner:** Amazon
- **Beneficiaries:** 2326 Children, 3930 Adolescents, and 395 Youth
- **Location:** Kumarikatta (Assam), Hyderabad (Telangana), Kattappana (Kerala), Tiruppur (Tamil Nadu), Nabasardar (Tripura), Varadarajanpet (Tamil Nadu), Rajanagar (Arunachal Pradesh), Azimganj (West Bengal), North Goa (Goa), Ahmednagar (Maharashtra), Jharmari (Punjab)

#### Activities Conducted:

- 110 assembled PCs were set up in 11 computer labs
- 3-hours virtual training was conducted for 22 teachers from beneficiary institutions on "Digital Security and Safety".

#### Outcome:

- Established computer labs in 9 low-cost private schools in rural areas, 1 degree college and 1 ITI, benefitting 6651 student
- 100% of students are utilising computers for their practical training associated with the computer science subject taught as part of the regular curriculum.



## 02. Supportive Education and Empowerment Program (SEEP)

- **Partner:** Sony Pictures Networks
- **Beneficiaries:** 1806 children from impoverished households in tribal and rural regions
- **Location:** Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu

### Activities Conducted:

- 60 remedial education centres were established in Ramnad District, Tamil Nadu and Palghar District, Maharashtra.
- 7-month educational rehabilitation program for children from impoverished households in tribal and rural regions of Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu.
- Classes conducted either before or after school based on the region.
- 2 hours of supplementary classes were conducted by SEEP animators wherein Maths, English, Tamil/Marathi and Science were taught.
- Child Rights Training with external Resource Persons organised, to educate the children about various Rights of minors under UNCRC and various Indian Laws. The sessions also focused on generating awareness amongst the children about various forms of child abuse and prevention strategies to use when experiencing or witnessing child abuse.
- 60 child parliaments formed to convene monthly to discuss various issues affecting its members.

### Outcome:

- 96% of beneficiaries have obtained government-mandated minimum levels of learning.
- 85% of beneficiaries have shown improvement in their grades compared to their baseline levels.
- 420 Child rights training conducted
- 60 Child Parliaments formed
- 22 Request Letters including problems with the repair of school toilets, provision of drinking water, etc. were acted upon by the panchayat offices.
- 98% have a functional understanding of Child Abuse.



### 03. Empowering with Education

- **Beneficiaries:** 390 Children + 450 from 10 tuition centres
- **Location:** Bangalore, Kolkata

#### Activities Conducted:

- Remedial educational support, educational aids and weekly nutritional items.
- **Two-day training program** for teachers and Staff members, covering important topics.
- **Child Rights Awareness Programme** with Mr Ramaswamy (Member of CWC and the Juvenile Justice Board) focusing on an interactive session, educating them on the basic rights of children.
- **Life-Skills Training** focusing on providing input on time management.

#### Outcome:

- 840 children were provided with remedial educational support, educational aids and nutritional items weekly.
- 0 children dropped out of school to be engaged in child labour during the project period.
- 36 school children dropouts were re-enrolled in school.
- 15 cases of child labour prevention were achieved through intervention.
- At least 80% of the children have shown improvement in grades.



## 04. Rehabilitation through Education

- **Partner:** LIC-HFL
- **Beneficiaries:** 510 children from 11 remedial education centres
- **Location:** Howrah, West Bengal

### Activities Conducted:

- Remedial educational support and educational aids were provided.
- Child rights training with the help of the District Childline. Topics dealt with were child protection, hygiene, and the need for education in life.
- One-day training for the teachers to fine-tune their teaching skills.
- Parents Meeting for the parents of beneficiaries, wherein the District Childline gave necessary inputs like child protection, Hygiene, Immunization, Government Schemes, Child Marriage and the need to send the children to school regularly.

### Outcome:

- Academic and offset learning gaps bridged that the children experienced due to dropping out of school.
- The children were given educational materials for the current and upcoming academic year.



## 05. Education Support For the Underprivileged Children

- **Partner:** Don Bosco Mondo
- **Beneficiaries:** 45 children
- **Location:** Don Bosco Ashalayam, Delhi

### Activities Conducted:

- Cleaning session including a bath, clean clothes, and grooming, setting up for the day.
- Regular rations were given to the families, much-needed respite to many without any source of income.
- Academic coaching and other support at the centre.
- Enrolled in regular schools, with all educational support (fees, books, uniforms etc.), additional tuition, nutritious food, healthcare, recreation, celebrations, and opportunities to cherish their childhood, protects them from becoming child workers and begging.
- Three children from a Marginalised family are being supported to complete their school and college education for better career opportunities in life.
- Children are being supported with vocational skill training courses, viz. computer skills, beautician course, fashion designing, hospitality course, and communication skills for ensuring their sustained livelihood.

### Outcome:

- The children were able to study and enter into mainstream education through an intermediary bridge program.
- A total of 45 children received academic coaching and other support at the centre and were kept from going back to the streets.



## 06. Sponsorship of Education for Marginalised Girls

- **Partner:** Avekshaa Technologies (P) Ltd
- **Beneficiaries:** 15 Girl Children from Marginalised families
- **Location:** Devadurga, Karnataka

### Activities Conducted:

- Supported the education of 15 girls from economically disadvantaged backgrounds who come from marginalised households.
- Distribution of uniforms and stationery items

### Outcome:

- The sponsorship has had a profound impact on the education of these girls. With the financial support and resources provided, they have been able to access quality education, including tuition fees, textbooks, school supplies, and additional educational support. This has significantly enhanced their learning experience and academic performance.
- The removal of financial barriers through sponsorship has allowed the girls to focus more on their studies without worrying about the financial struggles their families face. This has resulted in increased concentration, motivation, and improved overall well-being.



## 07. Empowering Lives: Education and Development for Underprivileged Children

- **Partner:** Bosconet
- **Location:** Don Bosco Ashalayam, Delhi
- **Beneficiaries:** 80 – 120 underprivileged Children

### Activities Conducted:

- **Education and Overall Development:** Education and overall development (physical, intellectual, social, and spiritual) of the children with tuition classes, computer classes, and English coaching to help improve their academic performance.
- **Skill Training and Higher Studies:** Children prepared for their future by providing skill training and opportunities for higher studies. This empowers them to become self-reliant earning members of society.
- **Counselling:** Regular counselling to support their personal growth and development.
- **Extra-Curricular Activities:** Opportunities to engage in various extra-curricular activities such as dance classes, singing and music classes, arts and crafts, and professional sports training in basketball and football.
- **Basic Necessities:** Children's basic needs including food, clothes, medicines, school uniforms, stationery, and transportation are met.

### Outcome:

- The children are empowered under the care of Don Bosco Ashalayam to lead a self-sufficient and fulfilling life.
- Through education, skill training, and support in various areas, the children gain the necessary tools to become contributing members of society.

### Planned Activities for The Next Period:

- Additional beneficial activities to be included such as computer literacy, soft skills training, and further focus on arts and crafts to contribute to the overall growth and development of the children, providing them with diverse skills and opportunities for their future.



## 08. Nurturing Young Minds, Overcoming Challenges

- **Partner:** Freundeskreis Wider Vision Foundation, Germany
- **Location:** Varanasi
- **Beneficiaries:** 80 boys and girls from financially weak families in Varanasi.

### Activities Conducted:

- **Holistic Education:** For the students, focusing on raising the teaching quality to ensure a comprehensive learning experience.
- **Adapting to Pandemic Challenges:** During the two years of the pandemic, the teachers worked diligently with the students by circulating worksheets to their homes since online facilities were not available.
- **New Experiential Activities:** Such as gardening, learning how to care for plants, creating simple musical instruments, making decorations and greeting cards, learning new songs and dances, and participating in small meditative practices to help them relax and find joy.
- **Support for Teaching Staff:** Support to the teaching staff, who also come from meagre financial backgrounds and faced challenges during the pandemic.

### Outcome:

Despite the challenges posed by the pandemic and the financial hardships faced by both students' families and teaching staff, the School remained committed to providing quality education and a nurturing environment for the students. The school's efforts in introducing experiential activities helped the children find joy and overcome the stress of the past years. By offering support and appreciation to the teachers, the school fostered a positive and encouraging atmosphere for both students and staff.



# SKILLING FOR SUSTAINABLE LIVING



Promoting opportunities for the well-being of young people by actively implementing programmes to enable youth with technical skills to become self-reliant and productive citizens.

## 01. Empowering Underprivileged Youth with Multimedia and Design Skills


- **Partner:** CMS Infoservices Pvt. Ltd
- **Reach:** Youth from low-income rural households
- **Beneficiaries:** 50 Underprivileged youth at DB MIDEA (Don Bosco Media Initiatives for Development Empowerment and Awareness)
- **Location:** Manikandam, Trichy, Tamil Nadu

### Activities Conducted:

- Six-month skill training course in Multimedia and Design for underprivileged youth at DB MIDEA, Manikandam, Trichy, Tamil Nadu.
- 50 youth from low-income rural households were trained and provided on-the-job training, placement services and handholding support.
- 16 trainees have been mobilised. Upon completing their training, they did a one-month internship at a media services establishment. They were provided institutional certificates after they successfully cleared the final assessment.

### Outcome:

90% of the beneficiaries placed with an average monthly salary range of Rs. 10,000–Rs. 15,000.



## 02. Don Bosco Education & Animation for Leadership (DEAL)

- **Partner:** Salesian Mission, Madrid, Spain
- **Location:** Chennai
- **Beneficiaries:** Young candidates from across the country, who face challenges in acclimatising to varied cultural-socio issues.

### Activities Conducted:

**Application and Selection Process:** Interested and eligible candidates applied through a Google form. Applicants were shortlisted based on consistent performance and scores for a written test and interview.

**Academic Coaching and Preparation:** Selected candidates underwent academic coaching at Officers IAS Academy, Anna Nagar, Chennai. The course covered a detailed programme throughout the year, including classes, self-study, optional subject classes, test series, group discussions, and mentorship programmes.

**Monthly Meetings and Motivation:** The candidates were regularly accompanied through monthly meetings, providing opportunities to assess progress and interact with special speakers for motivation and inspiration.

**Post-Prelim Evaluation and Future Plans:** After the Preliminary exams, the group evaluated the year's progress and programme.

### Outcome:

Encouraging results were received from the past two batches. Several candidates have cleared state-level Group 1 & 2 exams and are currently serving as Tahsildars and Department Officers in Telangana and Tamil Nadu.

One candidate has joined the Indian Forest Services (IFoS). The programme has created significant awareness among youth about bureaucratic careers and government services as viable options for serving God and society.

### 03. Empowering Livelihoods and Fostering Economic Inclusivity

- **Partner:** Macquarie Global Services Pvt. Ltd. limited and Macquarie Capital Securities(India) Pvt. Ltd.
- **Location:** Delhi, Trichy, Chennai, Hyderabad, Bangalore, Dimapur, Guwahati, Kolkata
- **Beneficiaries:** 12,897 young migrant job seekers, first-generation graduates, SC and ST candidates, and freshers from diverse backgrounds.

#### Activities Conducted:

- **Digital Inclusion and Equal Opportunities:** Facilitated digital inclusion by providing a web portal and app, benefiting over 12,897 candidates, including 8,444 males and 4,453 females, ensuring gender equality. Registrations from marginalised groups, such as first-generation graduates, SC and ST candidates, and freshers, highlight the network's commitment to equal opportunities.
- **Employability Skill Training:** Conducted 134 training programs, equipping 8,299 young migrant job seekers with essential job-acquiring skills. Training included resume preparation, interview techniques, and industry-specific knowledge, enhancing their employability and economic growth prospects.
- **Job Placement and Economic Empowerment:** With collaboration from 212 registered recruiters, over 15,000 job vacancies were offered through the web portal.
- **Outreach and Awareness:** Active reach out to underserved communities through community programs, institution visits, job fairs, and radio programs, providing guidance and information about job opportunities, training programs, and government schemes to over 15,000 migrant job seekers.
- **Help Location Services:** Don Bosco institutions located in destination points play a crucial role in providing essential support and guidance to migrant workers, ensuring a smooth transition into the job market and contributing to successful job placements.

#### Outcome:

- Don Bosco Job Placement Network's efforts have resulted in significant improvements in the livelihoods of underserved job seekers. Through digital inclusion and employability skill training, the network empowers candidates with the necessary skills and knowledge to secure suitable job placements.
- Successfully placed 6,270 job seekers across various sectors, providing decent and safe employment with access to benefits like EPF and ESI, thus empowering their economic status.
- The collaborations with various organisations have expanded the network's reach, facilitating connections between job seekers and employers.



# EMPOWERING WOMEN AND COMMUNITIES



Giving communities a voice and enabling women by supporting them with nutrition, sustainable skills and literacy to live a life of dignity.

## 01. Stitching a Better Future- Sui Dhaga

- **Partner:** Safeway
- **Beneficiaries:** 25 Women from distressed and marginalised backgrounds
- **Location:** Surakshita Home, Ravulapalem, Andhra Pradesh

### Activities Conducted:

- 3-month tailoring course for women from vulnerable backgrounds, residing at Surakshita Home in Ravulapalem, Andhra Pradesh.
- Basic financial literacy and awareness about government schemes they can access.
- 25 women successfully completed their training and were given a tailoring machine as seed capital support to start their home tailoring business.

### Outcome:

It is expected that these women will also earn an average of Rs. 6000 per month within three months of completing their training. This collaboration provides an opportunity for women to gain skills, income and become self-sufficient.



## 02.Support for the Poor to Avail the Various Welfare Benefits

- **Partner:** BMZ and Don Bosco Mission Bonn
- **Beneficiaries:** 200,000+ People
- **Location:** Goa, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Delhi, and Tamil Nadu.

### Activities Conducted:

Building the capacity of civil society organisations (CSOs) to create awareness about the various welfare schemes and entitlements among the poor and weaker sections of society and extend support to access the benefits was started in 2019 and completed by March 2023 with the thankful support of BMZ through Don Bosco Mission, Bonn.

### Outcome:

More than 750 CSOs have been trained in participatory approach skills, advocacy skills, lobbying skills, negotiation skills, and welfare schemes, and about 200,000+ people were helped to access their welfare benefits in Goa, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Delhi, and Tamil Nadu.



## CARING FOR OUR COMMON HOME - PLANET EARTH



Promoting life in productive harmony with nature by promoting sustainable choices through awareness drives and educational measures, skill training and partnerships.

### 01. Take A Stand, Take A Plant

Don Bosco Network celebrated World Environment Day by initiating a 2-day engagement program at malls in Kolkata and Howrah to engage donors towards the cause of educating girl children. A total of 250 Gifts of plants in 3 Malls served as tokens of appreciation to our donors and as a reminder of their support towards aiding the growth of girls in various Don Bosco shelters.



# RESPONDING TO DISASTERS

## 01. Towards Rescue and Relief

- **Partner:** Amazon, Nestle and Give India
- **Aid:** 8723 Flood Relief Kits, Dry ration kits and hygiene materials
- **Location:** Assam, Konaseema District, Andhra Pradesh

### Activities Conducted:

- Distribution of Flood Relief Kits, Dry ration kits and hygiene materials through partner PDOs- Don Bosco Development Society, AIDA, Bosco Reach Out Don Bosco, Silchar and BIDS- Shillong to families in Assam.
- Emergency flood shelter kits distribution to families in Andhra Pradesh.

### Outcome:

- Relief to families in Assam through the distribution of 8723 Flood Relief, Dry ration kits and hygiene materials.
- Assisted families in Andhra Pradesh through 1000 Emergency flood shelter kits.






